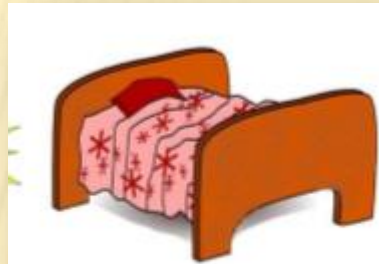

- 4. Use fact families.**

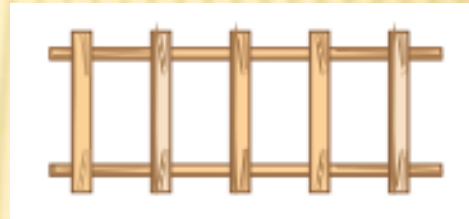

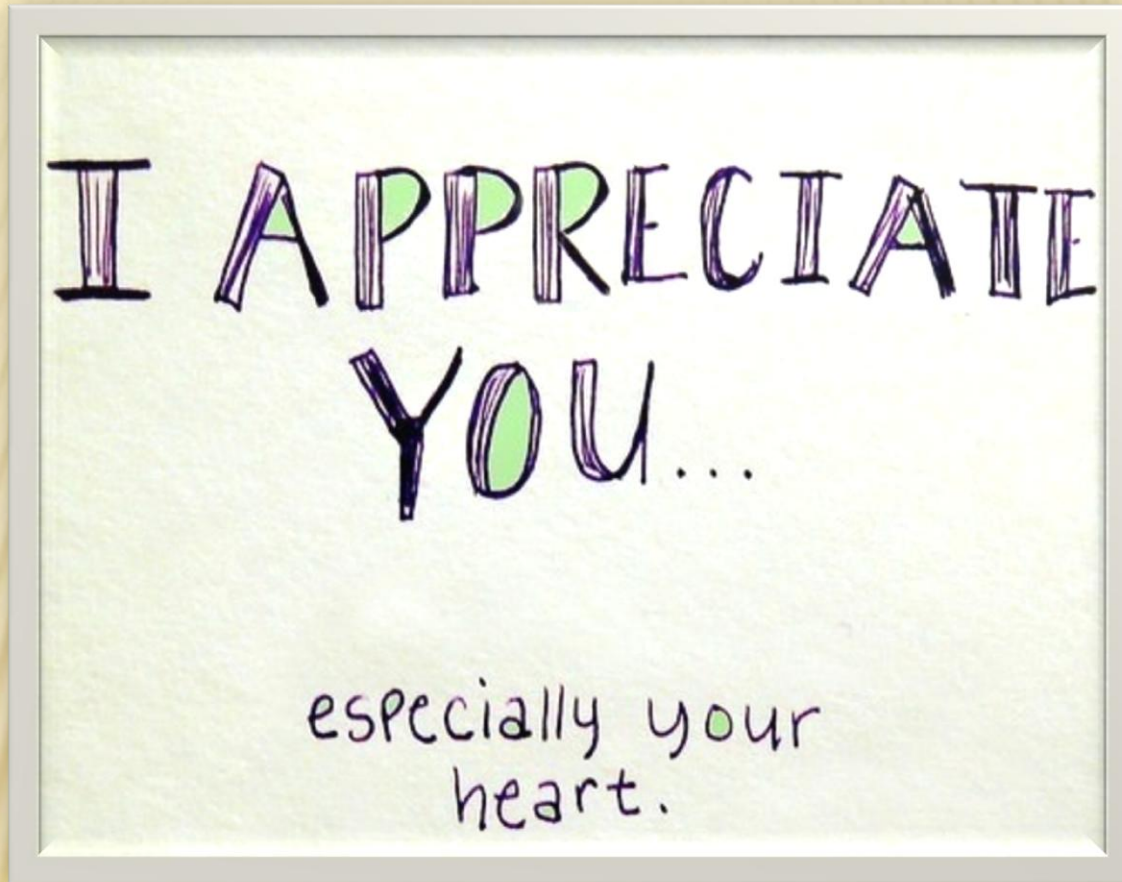
REMINDERS
